Summary: (10pts)

Following the summary rules we have learned and practiced this year (NB pg 22 for examples/notes), write a 13-20 sentence summary of the book that you read. You **must** include a topic sentence that introduces the title & author of the book. Remember: your summary is meant for someone who has not read the book. Choose the most important ideas & events from the story to share. Remember to use character names at times, do not rely solely on pronouns.

Most Important Scene: (10pts)

Draw & color a scene, character, or theme from the story that is significant to the plot. Explain in an 8-15 sentence paragraph what the picture is and its importance to the story. Make sure you explain your answer well.

Book Review: (5pts)

Write a review of your B.O.B book. Be sure to talk about what you did or did not like about the characters, action, plot, resolution, or author's story telling style. Would you recommend this book for someone else to read? Why or why not? Your answer should be 8-15 sentences long.
